Briefing

The monthly publication of Building Materials Price Statistics is of great significance as building material prices are deemed to be important economic indicators for planning and research in various fields. They are also used in the compilation of indices of the construction activity and for the calculation of GDP at constant prices.

Statistical centres all over the world collect prices of building materials used by a large segment of people. As a result of the urban development and the constant growth in the construction sector in the Emirate, Statistics Centre – Abu Dhabi collects price data for these materials on a regular basis.

The movements of prices of 21 groups from the key building materials are included in this publication. This information helps decision and policy makers and researchers in planning and making sound decisions in support of the building materials sector and other sectors associated with it.

Key Points

This report provides the movement of prices of twenty-one groups of building material in September 2018 compared to August of the same year and September of 2017. The main results of this report are as follows:

- During September 2018, the average prices of 'Tiles and marble' increased by 6.3%, 'Waterproofing products' by 4.9% and the 'Glass' group increased by 3.0%, compared with August 2018.
- During September 2018, the average price of 'Roofing Materials' decreased by 6.1%, 'Concrete' by 2.7% and '(PVC) Pipes' by 1.2% compared with August 2018.
- During September 2018 the average price of the 'Diesel' increased by 32.0%, 'Wires Apartments' by 21.1% and 'Wires for Small Building' by 14.8% compared with September 2017.
- During September 2018, the average prices of '(uPVC) Pipes' decreased by 8.9% and 'Concrete' decreased by 3.1% and steel 2.7% compared with September 2017.
- During the third quarter of 2018 compared with the second quarter of 2018, the average price of the 'Diesel' group increased by 3.7%, 'Cement' by 2.3% and 'Employment / with all services' by 1.8%. The average prices of 'Roofing materials' decreased by 3.7%, 'Power Cable' decreased by 1.9%, and '(uPVC) Pipes' by 1.5% compared with the second quarter 2018.
- During the third quarter of 2018 compared with the same period in the previous year, the average prices of 'Diesel' increased by 38.8%, the prices of 'Wires for Apartments' increased by 22.2%, and 'Wires for Small Building' increased by 14.4%. The average prices of '(uPVC) Pipes'' decreased by 1.6% and 'Concrete' decreased by 1.3%.

Technical notes

The current methodology for Building Materials Price Statistics including conceptual basis, construction of the basket, data collection, validation, processing procedures, averaging and treatment of missing values, and potential sources of error are described in the Building Materials Price Statistics 2015 publication, which is available on SCAD's website at www.scad.gov.abudhabi.

Data sources

Data are obtained from the monthly survey of Building Materials Prices; the data are collected, processed and passed to Statistic Centre – Abu Dhabi for further editing and compilation.

These procedures are in line with the policy of the Statistics Center - Abu Dhabi.
