Briefing

The monthly publication of Building Materials Price Statistics is of great significance as building material prices are deemed to be important economic indicators for planning and research in various fields. They are also used in the compilation of indices of the construction activity and for the calculation of GDP at constant prices.

Statistical centers all over the world collect prices of building materials used by a large segment of people. As a result of the urban development and the constant growth in the construction sector in the Emirate, Statistics Centre – Abu Dhabi collects price data for these materials on a regular basis.

The movements of prices of 21 groups from the key building materials are included in this publication. This information helps decision and policy makers and researchers in planning and making sound decisions in support of the building materials sector and other sectors associated with it.

Key Points

This publication provides the movement of prices of twenty-one groups of building materials in September 2019 compared with August 2019 and September of 2018. The report also contains the average price of the third quarter 2019 compared with the same period in the previous year and the second quarter 2019. The main results are as follows:

- During September 2019, the average prices of '(PVC) Pipes' increased by 5.2%, 'Employment \
 with all services' increased by 1.7% 'Tiles and marble' increased by 0.8% compared with August
 2019.
- During September 2019, the average price of 'Wires for Small Building' decreased by 5.2%, 'Wood' decreased by 2.4% and ''Wires for Residential Towers'' decreased by 2.3% compared with August 2019.
- During September 2019, the average price of 'Transport equipment' increased by 9.6%, 'Bathroom Set without Accessories' increased by 7.1% and 'Tiles and Marble' increased by 6.4% compared with August 2018.
- During September 2019, the average prices of 'Glass' decreased by 23.6%, 'Wires for Small Building' decreased by 10.5% and 'Diesel' decreased by 9.8% compared with September 2018.
- During the third quarter of 2019 compared with the second quarter of 2019, the average price of the 'Wires for Apartments' group increased by 8.7%, 'Wires for Small Building' by 2.2% and '(PVC) Pipes' by 1.9%. The average prices of 'Glass' decreased by 10.6%, 'Diesel' decreased by 5.7%, and 'Tiles and Marble' by 2.8% compared with the second quarter 2019.



• During the third quarter of 2019 compared with the same period in the previous year, the average prices of 'Transport equipment' increased by 11.8%, the prices of 'Tiles and marble' increased by 10.3%, and 'paints' increased by 7.7%. The average prices of 'Glass' decreased by 22.5% and 'Diesel' by 9.8%.and 'Aggregates and sand' by 9.4%.

Technical notes

The current methodology for Building Materials Price Statistics including conceptual basis, construction of the basket, data collection, validation, processing procedures, averaging and treatment of missing values, and potential sources of error are described in the Building Materials Price Statistics 2015 publication, which is available on SCAD's website at **www.scad.gov.abudhabi**.

Data sources

Data are obtained from the monthly survey of Building Materials Prices; the data are collected, processed and passed to Statistic Centre – Abu Dhabi for further editing and compilation.
